children in the Foster Care system in Solano County.

- Approximately **60 children** are sent out of county each year, often due to lack of foster homes.
- On average, 20 teens per year age out of the foster care system.
- There are 208 churches in Solano County.

If even a fraction of these churches raise up one foster family with a team of support, there will be more than enough loving homes to meet the need.

Long Term Impact

- 46% of foster youth **fail to complete high** school.
- 1-in-4 will be involved in the justice system within two years of aging out.
- 33% of youth who age out of foster care **experience homelessness.**
- Rates of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder among foster care alumni are up to twice the rate of US war veterans who have experienced combat.

Did You Know?

Although African
Americans make up
13.6% of the child
population, 40% of
children in foster
care in Solano
County are Black.

Approximately 16% of Solano County youth who reunify reenter foster care in less than 12 months.
